



Rainbow Sugar Chart

For decorating desserts

Ingredients:

2 cups sugar, divided
Liquid food coloring
6 plastic food storage bags

Preparation Time: 15 minutes
Baking Time: None
Makes: 6 colors, 1/3 cup each

Directions:

1. Place 1/3 cup sugar in each re-sealable plastic bag.
2. Use color chart and drop food coloring in each bag to make different colors.
3. Remove extra air and seal each bag completely.
4. Using hands squish and squeeze the bag to blend color with sugar in each bag.
5. Use colored sugar for decorating Quilt Cake, Sugar Cookies, etc.

COLOR	NUMBER OF DROPS OF LIQUID FOOD COLOR
Orange	3 drops yellow and 3 drops red
Sunset Peach	4 drops yellow and 1 drop red
Yellow	6 drops yellow
Green	8 drops green
Green Apple	3 drops yellow and 1 drop green
Blue	5 drops blue
Aqua	3 drops blue and 1 drop green
Sky Blue	2 drops blue
Purple	3 drops red and 2 drops blue
Red	10 drops red
Rose Petal	6 drops red and 1 drop blue
Baby Pink	1 drop red

Fun Fact:

Primary colors (red, blue, yellow) are used to make all other colors. Secondary colors are made when primary colors are mixed (violet, orange, green).

Family Activity:

Create an edible picture through food decoration. Colored sugars can also be used to roll sugar cookie dough in before baking, to sprinkle on frosted white cupcakes or to create a small "sand" art jar of colored layers.
